What will we need to do to make student data visualizations as routine and universal as a clock face or speedometer?

 George Siemens: Everything in education is content-centric. And that's exactly the wrong approach,

- Kathleen Styles: The appropriate use of high quality data is perhaps the best way to transform education.
- Kathleen Styles: Regarding big data, privacy isn't a Republican or Democratic issue-it's where the far left meets the far right to box out the moderate middle.


- Kathleen Styles: Hard to have a FACT-based conversation about privacy and data in education. All tends to be emotion-driven.
- In the past we've known our content, in the future we will know our learners.

- What does notice and consent mean in the modern world?
- Tom McTavish: Visualizations are dialogs-vocabulary and grammar to describe and show information in visual space using motion and color.

- Insight is a good word for the basic tenet of information theory that non-obvious results are the key to finding value in data.
- Correlation is not causality-need underlying models.
