Position Characteristics: The Department of Literacy, Early, Bilingual and Special Education (LEBSE) invites applications for a tenure-track, assistant professor position in Early Childhood Education. The successful candidate will teach in a NAEYC accredited teacher preparation program in Early Childhood Education that prepares teachers for preK-8th grade classroom teaching with a specific emphasis on the early childhood years (0-8 years), as well as teaching in a graduate MA program in Early Childhood Education. We expect the successful candidate to demonstrate a commitment to teaching excellence and scholarly activity, to pursue internal and external funding that supports areas of program need and professional inquiry. Specific assignments will depend on departmental needs. The successful candidate may be called upon to teach in a distance-learning mode and encouraged to develop web-enhanced and/or web-based instruction. Outcomes assessment and service learning are important components of the university curriculum. Faculty members are also expected to engage in service activities at all levels of the university and provide academic and professional advise to students. The successful candidate will be expected to communicate effectively and work cooperatively with faculty, staff, and administration.

Academic Preparation: The successful candidate should hold a doctorate in Early Childhood Education, Educational Psychology, Child Development or related field. Candidates nearing completion of the doctorate (ABD) may be considered; however, the doctorate must be completed by the time of initial appointment.

Teaching Or Other Experience: Required areas of expertise for this position: 2 or more years of teaching experience in early childhood settings that includes, but is not restricted to, public school settings; an elementary education teaching credential or equivalent; experience working with diverse students, families and schools; demonstrated potential for research and scholarly activity in ECE; and, a strong background in the areas of ECE theory and research, foundations and curriculum. Additional preferred experiences: leadership skills/administrative background in preschool settings and NAEYC accredited programs; community outreach to improve the quality of ECE; collaborative work with schools and school districts; supervision of student teachers in classroom settings; background/experience in ECE/Special Education; expertise in one of the following: curriculum and assessment; early literacy; cultural and linguistic diversity; inclusion of children with special needs. Candidates with experience working with diverse groups and in diverse settings are encouraged to apply. The successful candidate must demonstrate a commitment and/or ability to work with diverse faculty, staff, and students. The University is committed to promoting the success of all, and to reducing the barriers to success related to differences in areas such as race, ethnicity, culture, disability, and more.
